- **GENERAL DESCRIPTION.** This course is designed as an advanced introduction to classical sentential and predicate logic. No previous acquaintance with logic is required. Nonetheless a willingness to master technicalities and to work at a certain level of abstraction is desirable.
- **ORGANIZATION.** The course is organized in two lecture sessions (MW 2:40–3:55) and a mandatory discussion session (time and location TBA).
- **REQUIREMENTS.** There will be two one-hour tests and a final three-hour examination. Each test will be worth 25% of the final grade; the examination will account for 40%. The remaining 10% will be based on weekly home assignments and participation in the discussion sessions.
- **TEXT.** The textbook is Haim Gaifman's *A Course in Symbolic Logic*. This book is not yet in print; bound copies may be purchased at *Village Copier* on Broadway.
