Islamic Philosophy: the notion of a cosmic order.

The seminar will be devoted to the notion of a cosmic order. Al Farabi's concept of the "perfect State" as the earthly reflection of the cosmic order will be examined. The relationship between self- realization and cosmology will be also studied in the works of Avicenna (*Mi'raj* nama) Al Ghazali (Niche of Lights), Suhrawardî (*philosophy of Illumination*), Ibn Bajjah (*Rule of the Solitary*), or Ibn Tufayl (*Hayy ibn Yaqzan*) for the classical period of Islamic philosophy. Finally we will read the work, in the twentieth century, of Indian poet and philosopher Muhammad Iqbal as a philosophy of self realization in an emergent cosmology.
